On 1 September 2016 Virginia launched its new Developmental Disabilities Medicaid Waiver Program. The Family & Individual (FIS) Waiver, the Community Living (CL) Waiver, and Building Independence (BI) Waiver, now fall under the umbrella of the Developmental Disabilities Waiver Program.

About Commonwealth Coordinated Care Plus (CCC Plus)?

On August 1, 2017, the Department of Medical Assistance Services (DMAS) will implement a new managed long term services and supports (MLTSS) initiative known as is Commonwealth Coordinated Care Plus (CCC Plus). CCC Plus will operate statewide across six regions as a mandatory Medicaid managed care program. It will serve approximately 214,000 individuals including adults and children with disabilities and complex care needs. CCC Plus will also include individuals who qualify for both Medicare and Medicaid, as well as individuals that receive long term services and supports through a nursing facility or through the community.

Key Things to Know About CCC Plus

1. Participation is required by those who are currently eligible. Eligibility includes: those persons who are on full Medicaid over 65 or disabled, those receiving both Medicare and Medicaid benefits (dual eligible), those receiving Medicaid through home and community waivers (those on redesigned Developmental Disabilities waivers will enroll for non-waiver services only).
2. Enrollment will start August 1st in the Tidewater area and then to various districts of the commonwealth in the months thereafter.

3. Focus is on care coordination and person centered care with an interdisciplinary team approach.
4. There will be provider and member town hall meetings scheduled to discuss the changes.
5. Community Mental Health Rehabilitation Services will be carved out until Jan 1, 2018. These services will be covered by Magellan, the behavioral health services contractor for DMAS.

6. Enrollees will have a choice of 6 different managed care organizations:

Aetna Better Health of Virginia
 Anthem Healthkeepers Plus
 Magellan Complete Care of Virginia

Optima Health
 United Healthcare
 Virginia Premier Health Plan

7. Key differences between CCC Plus and CCC are noted in the chart below:

8. Enrollment will start with receiving a letter of an initial enrollment into a Managed Care Organization (MCO) and a comparison chart of the options available in the region. Enrollee may change the MCO by contacting the third party broker, Maximus, whose information will be in the letter and a deadline to change. Changes will need to be finalized within 90 days from date of enrollment letter. Annual enrollment will be from October to December with an effective date of January 1st.
